

What is Riversymposium?

International Riversymposium is the pre-eminent international river conference linking business to science, policy and communities.

SPONSORED DELEGATES

Through the Sponsored Delegates Program IRF and its partners financially support a number of river scientists and practitioners from less developed countries to attend the International Riversymposium each year.



The Virtual Difference

The COVID-19 pandemic meant that Riversymposium could not be run in China as planned, therefore IRF partnered with Iconic Live, an Australian online event management company, to provide the virtual platform – Delegate Connect. This innovative and engaging platform meant that delegates and presenters experienced a program that was simple to navigate and easy to use.

Iconic live, our exclusive digital partner ensured the smooth transition of the IRS to an online event. All keynote speakers, presenters and facilitators, as well as delegates were kept informed and prepared at all times by the very able technical team

In addition to the Delegate Connect platform the IRF also utilised Remo, an online networking platform that immersed delegates further into the v-IRS. Remo enables participants to select a table to sit at and they can move from table to table, share virtual business cards and chat between one another via video or text. Both Diversity in Water and Virtual Networking was run in this platform.

The challenge of virtual conferences is to make delegates feel connected and engaged. We feel that Delegate Connect and Remo did this successfully. In addition, our online social networking events such as Rivers Got Talent! and River*Trivia* also bridged the gap between a virtual event and a face-to-face event.

2021 will no doubt still be affected by the pandemic and therefore it is intended that Riversymposium will continue to offer a virtual option for delegates who cannot attend a face-to-face event.

Program Highlights

DIVERSITY IN WATER

Diversity in Water was held using the networking platform Remo. The theme "Working across boundaries" saw four panel members, Jo Bacallo, Anthony De Domenico, David Greenup and Sally Lawrence, come together to discuss working in river management across sectoral, geographical, cultural and gender boundaries.



SPONSORED DELEGATES

This year, the International RiverFoundation and the Asian Development Bank supported over 50 delegates from developing countries to attend Riversymposium. This included delegates from Nepal, Sri Lanka, Pakistan, South Africa, Kenya, Chile, Brazil and Indonesia.



RIVERS GOT TALENT

Rivers Got Talent was an online talent competition which received seven extremely high level of entrants. Two winners were announced during Riversymposium. The People's Choice winner was the New World Rhythm Choir from the Queensland's Sunshine Coast and the Judges Prize went to Brett Leavy, a First Nations, Digital Aboriginal who descends from the Kooma People.



RIVER GALLERY

RiverGallery was introduced this year to provide delegates with another way to feel connected to the subject matter - rivers. Artists were invited to submit photos, drawings and paintings that were then displayed in the online 3D gallery at no cost to the artist. We received 25 submissions from all over the world. It is envisaged that RiverGallery will become a regular part of Riversymposium in the future.



VIRTUAL NETWORKING

On the final day, a social networking session was introduced to give delegates an opportunity to connect with one another in an informal setting. The platform Remo was used which enabled delegates to move around from table to table and share their virtual business cards.



RESILIENT RIVERS BLUPRINT (RRBP) PRE-IRS WORKSHOP

Building on from the launch of the RRBP partners in 2019, this showcased seven river basins that have taken part in testing the RRBP self-assessment tools and through a facilitated discussion, openly discussed the issues, challenges and opportunities associated with these tools.





